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Background

Books From Birth is a DC Public Library initiative that sends free books to children in the District of Columbia under the age of 5. If caregivers have more access to books, they are much more likely to read with their children, which will have a great impact on their ability to learn how to read when they enter kindergarten. Having books at home also helps cultivate a joy of learning for children, creating lifelong readers.


HELPING PARENTS CREATE A BRIGHTER FUTURE FOR THEIR CHILDREN

The Books from Birth program is part of the Library's larger early literacy initiative Sing, Talk, and Read (STAR). Through STAR, the Library encourages caregivers to take an active role in their children's early learning. Singing, talking, and reading with children from birth prepares them to learn to read when they start school and creates a solid foundation for a lifelong love of learning. The Books from Birth initiative helps parents make reading a daily habit. By combining the promotion and instruction of STAR behaviors amongst parents with the increased access to books, all children in D.C. will be successful readers better equipped to realize their full potential.



Our Goals

In 2019, the library delivered its millionth Books from Birth book. As the program continues to grow, the Library hopes to accomplish the following:



To provide quality children's books to every child in the District under the age of 5.

To connect Books from Birth families with other library services and resources to cultivate a lifelong joy of reading and learning.

NEWSLETTER LANGUAGE

Register your child to receive a FREE book every month. All D.C. kids from birth to 5 can receive free books from DC Public Library in the mail once a month. Kids who are signed up when they are born will receive 60 books by the time they turn 5. To sign up visit <u>dclibrary.org/booksfrombirth</u>.

TALKING POINTS

The Library has created a list of specific talking points that can help you as you discuss the new Books from Birth program with your constituents and people you serve.

- To register your child for the Books from Birth program, please visit <u>dclibrary.org/booksfrombirth</u>.
- The Books from Birth program is completely free.
- All children who live in Washington, D.C., are eligible for the program until they turn 5 years old.
- Children receive the free books directly in the mail.
- The program makes reading with your child easier and it will help you get them ready to learn when they start school.
- The books are selected by professionals and are age-appropriate for every child enrolled in the program.

- You must be the child's parent or legal guardian to register them for the program.
- Kids who are signed up at birth will receive up to 60 free books by the time they turn 5.
- You can build your child's very own personal library for FREE.
- Signing up for the program saves you both time and money.
- The books are free and they are delivered right to your family.
- The program could save you close to \$600 in book purchases over 5 years.
- Receiving a new free book every month will encourage your children to read more.
